
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Project: Flannel Rectangles Wall Quilt

INSPIRED BY FABRIC FUSION FROM DESIGNERS BILL KERR AND WEEKS RINGLE OF FUNQUILTS/MODERN QUILTS STUDIO (MODERNQUILTSSTUDIO.COM)





Flannels in shades of brown and green give a wall hanging a cozy camouflage look. Fabrics are from the Tailor Made collection for **Timeless Treasures Fabrics** (ttfabrics.net).

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Materials

- 1½ yards total assorted flannel prints and plaids in green, brown, and gold (blocks)
- 1¼ yards solid brown (sashing, border, binding)
- 2¹/₂ yards backing fabric
- 45×52" batting

Finished quilt: 36½×44" Finished block: 6½×8"

Quantities are for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics. Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Tips on Sewing Flannel

Prewash flannel because it tends to shrink. Since flannel is a mediumweight fabric, use a larger needle, such as 90/14. Flannel also has a tendency to stretch, so pin more than you normally would or stitch with a walking foot.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

From assorted flannel prints and plaids, cut:

- 50—31⁄2×5" rectangles
- 25—3×31⁄2" rectangles
- 50—2×31⁄2" rectangles

From solid brown, cut:

- 5—2**½**×42" binding strips
- 4—1¼×42" strips for border
- 14—1×42" strips
- 4—1×35" sashing strips
- 20—1×8½" sashing rectangles

Assemble Blocks

- Referring to Diagram 1, sew all assorted flannel print and plaid 2×3½" rectangles to solid brown 1×42" strips, leaving about ¼" between rectangles and chain-piecing. (Use as many solid brown strips as necessary.) To chain-piece, sew pieces together one after the other, without lifting the presser foot or clipping threads between units.
- Press seams open. Trim solid brown strips even with edges of flannel print and plaid 2×3¹/₂" rectangles (Diagram 2).
- Referring to Diagram 3, join a Step 2 unit and a flannel print or plaid 3¹/₂×5" rectangle to make Unit A. Press seam open. The unit should be 3¹/₂×7" including seam allowances. Repeat to make 25 total of Unit A.
- Referring to Diagram 4, sew together a Step 2 unit and a flannel print or plaid 3×3½" rectangle to make Unit B. Press seam open. The unit should be 3½×5" including seam allowances. Repeat to make 25 total of Unit B.
- Referring to Diagram 5, sew all A units to additional solid brown 1×42" strips, leaving about ¼" between units and chain-piecing; note placement of each Unit A on strip.
- 6. Press seams open. Trim solid brown strips even with edges of each Unit A to make 25 sashed A units (Diagram 6).
- Repeat steps 5 and 6 with remaining solid brown 1×42" strips and all B units to make 25 sashed B units (Diagrams 7 and 8).

- Referring to Diagram 9, sew together a sashed Unit B and a remaining flannel print or plaid 3½x5" rectangle to make Unit C. Press seam open. Repeat to make 25 total of Unit C.
- Join a sashed Unit A and a Unit C to make a block (Diagram 10). Press seam open. The block should be 7×8¹/2" including seam allowances. Repeat to make 25 blocks total.

Assemble Quilt Center

- Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, lay out five horizontal rows of five blocks and four solid brown 1×8½" sashing rectangles each, rotating every other block 180°. Sew together pieces in each block row. Press seams open.
- Join pieced rows and solid brown 1×35" sashing strips to make quilt center. Press seams open. The quilt center should be 35×421/2" including seam allowances.

Add Border

- Cut and piece solid brown 1¼×42" strips to make:
 - 2—1¼×42½" border strips
 - 2—1¼×36½" border strips
- 2. Sew long solid brown border strips to long edges of quilt center. Add short solid brown border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press all seams toward border strip.

Finish Quilt

- **1.** Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste. Quilt as desired.
- 2. Bind with solid brown binding strips.
