

Three-color blocks create a fun and bright wall hanging. Use scraps for a random assortment of blocks or stick with coordinating collections for a controlled look.



Materials

- 21—9×21" pieces (fat eighths) assorted prints in blue, orange, green, purple, yellow, and pink (blocks)
- ¼ yard blue print (corner triangles)
- ½ yard turquoise print (border)
- 1/2 yard binding fabric
- 2**1/8** yards backing fabric
- 51" square batting

Finished quilt: 42% square Finished block: 9 square

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

From each assorted print, cut:

- 4-3**%**" squares
- 5—3½" squares
- 4—1½" squares

From blue print, cut:

 2—7½" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 4 corner triangles total

From turquoise print, cut:

- $5-2\frac{1}{2}\times42$ " strips for border
- From binding fabric, cut:
- 5-21/2×42" border strips

Assemble Blocks

- Gather two 3½" squares from one print; four 1½" squares, two 3½" squares, and four 3½" squares from a second print; and a 3½" square from a third print.
- 2. Use a pencil to draw a diagonal line on wrong side of the print No. 1—3⅓" squares and the print No. 2—1½" squares.

- 3. Referring to Diagram 1, layer a marked print No. 1—3½" square atop a print No. 2—3½" square. Sew together with two seams, stitching ¼" on each side of drawn line. Cut pair apart on drawn line to make two triangle units. Press open each triangle unit, pressing seam toward darkest print, to make two triangle-squares. Each triangle-square should be 3½" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four triangle-squares total.
- 4. Align a marked print No. 2—1½" square with one corner of print No. 3—3½" square (Diagram 2; note direction of marked line). Sew on drawn line. Trim excess, leaving ¼" seam allowance. Press open attached triangle. In same manner, add marked print No. 2—1½" squares to remaining corners of 3½" square to make a Snowball unit (Diagram 3). The unit should be 3½" square including seam allowances.
- 5. Referring to Diagram 4, sew together triangle-squares, print No. 2—3½" squares, and Snowball unit in three horizontal rows. Press seams toward 3½" squares. Join rows to make a block. Press seams away from Snowball unit. The block should be 9½" square including seam allowances.
- **6.** Repeat steps 1-5 to make 21 blocks total.

Assemble Quilt Center

 Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, lay out blocks in five diagonal rows.

- Sew together blocks in each row. Press seams in one direction, alternating direction with each row. Join rows; press seams in one direction. Add blue print corner triangles to make quilt center. Press seams toward corner triangles.
- 3. Referring to Diagram 5, trim quilt center 1/4" beyond points of blocks. The quilt center should be 385/6" square including seam allowances.

Add Border

- 1. Cut and piece turquoise print 2½×42" strips to make:
- 2-2½×425/8" border strips
- 2-21/2×385/8" border strips
- Add short border strips to opposite edges of quilt center. Add long border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press all seams toward border.

Finish Quilt

- Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste. Quilt as desired.
- 2. Bind with binding strips.






















