

Project: Scrap Lab Wall Hanging

Like to make the most of everything? Experiment with our challenge to create something special from a specific set of materials.

Simple squares and curved appliqués in bright prints pop off a coordinating solid to create a dynamic wall hanging.

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Materials

- ½ yard solid lavender (blocks)
- 5—18×22" pieces (fat quarters) assorted prints in green, blue, and aqua (blocks, sashing, border, binding)
- 13/8 yards backing fabric
- 28×49" batting
- Freezer paper
- Spray starch

Finished quilt: 20×41" Finished blocks: 7½" square

Quantities are for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics.

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order. Find the Leaf Pattern on page 3. To prepare leaf appliqués using a freezer-paper-and-starch method, complete the following steps.

- 1. Lay freezer paper, shiny side down, over Leaf Pattern. Use a pencil to trace pattern 20 times. Cut out freezer-paper shapes on drawn lines to make templates.
- 2. Using a hot dry iron, press each freezer-paper shape, shiny side down, onto wrong side of an assorted print; let cool. Cut out each fabric leaf, adding a 1/4" seam allowance to all edges. Clip seam allowances of curves as necessary, stopping a thread or two away from freezer-paper templates, to make appliqué pieces.
- 3. Spray a small amount of starch into a dish. Place a templatetopped appliqué piece facedown on a pressing surface covered with a tea towel or muslin. Dip a cotton swab in starch and moisten seam allowance of

- appliqué piece (Diagram 1). Using tip of a hot dry iron, turn seam allowance over one edge of freezer-paper template and press until fabric is dry. Continue in same manner around entire shape, adding starch as necessary and pressing fabric taut against template. Carefully peel off template to create a leaf appliqué.
- 4. Repeat Step 3 to prepare 20 leaf appliqués total.

From solid lavender, refer to Cutting Diagram, page 3, to cut:

- 5-8**½**" squares
- 10-1**¾**×8" rectangles
- 10—1**¾**×5**½**" rectangles

From one assorted print, cut:

■ 5-51/2" squares

From remaining assorted prints,

- Enough 2½"-wide strips in lengths ranging from 7" to 10" to total 140" for binding
- 77—2×2½" rectangles
- 20 of Leaf Pattern

Assemble Blocks

- 1. Referring to Diagram 2, sew solid lavender 13/4×51/2" rectangles to opposite edges of a print 5½" square. Press seams toward rectangles. Add solid lavender 13/4×8" rectangles to remaining edges to make a pieced block. Press seams toward rectangles. The block should be 8" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make five pieced blocks total.
- 2. Fold a solid lavender 8½" square horizontally and vertically; press lightly to create placement guidelines and unfold. Referring to Appliqué Placement Diagram, arrange four leaf appliqués on square; pin or baste pieces in place.


- 3. Using thread to match appliqués, machine-blanket-stitch around edges of leaf appliqués to make an appliquéd block. Trim block to 8" square including seam allowances.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make five appliquéd blocks total.

Assemble Sashing and Border

- 1. Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, join 19 assorted print 2×21/2" rectangles along short edges to make a sashing strip. Press seams in one direction. Trim strip to 2×38" including seam allowances.
- 2. Repeat Step 1 to make two long border strips; trim each to 2×38" including seam allowances.
- 3. Sew together 10 assorted print 2×21/2" rectangles along short edges to make a short border strip; press seams in one direction. Trim strip to 2×20" including seam allowances. Repeat to make a second short border strip.

Assemble Quilt Top


- 1. Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, lay out blocks in an alternating pattern in two vertical rows. Sew together pieces in each block row. Press seams in one direction. Join block rows and sashing strip to make quilt center; press seams away from sashing strip. The quilt center should be 17×38" including seam allowances.
- 2. Sew long border strips to long edges of quilt center. Add short border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press all seams away from border.




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Finish Quilt

- 1. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Outline-quilt around the leaf appliqués and stipple-quilt the remaining areas of the quilt top.
- 2. Using straight seams, sew together assorted print 21/2"wide strips to make a pieced binding strip. Bind quilt with pieced binding strip.





CUTTING DIAGRAM
