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Project: Curved Appliqué Table Runner

Materials

- 5—18×22" pieces (fat quarters) assorted solids in yellow, orange, green, white, and lavender (blocks)
- 15—10" squares assorted 1930s prints
- yard blue print (inner border)
- 1 yard red floral (outer border,
- 1⅓ yards backing fabric
- 35×47" batting
- Lightweight fusible web

Finished quilt: 281/2×401/2" Finished block: 6" square

Quantities are for 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics.

Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order.

From assorted solids, cut:

• $60-4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (15 sets of 4 matching squares)

From assorted 1930s prints, cut:

• $60-4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (15 sets of 4 matching squares)

From blue print, cut:

- 2—1½×30½" inner border strips
- 2—1½×20½" inner border strips

From red floral, cut:

- $2-4\frac{1}{2}\times32\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border strips
- 2-41/2×281/2" outer border
- 4-2½×42" binding strips

Assemble Four-Patch Units

1. Referring to Diagram 1, sew together two solid 41/2" squares and two print 4½" squares in pairs. Press seams open. Join pairs to make a large Four-Patch unit. Press seams open.

The large Four-Patch unit should be 81/2" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make a matching large Four-Patch unit.

- 2. Repeat Step 1 to make 30 large Four-Patch units total (15 sets of two matching units).
- 3. Centering the seam lines, trim a large Four-Patch unit to 6½" square, including seam allowances, to make a small Four-Patch unit. Repeat with one Four-Patch unit from each set to make 15 total small Four-Patch units.

Prepare Appliqués

- 1. Lay fusible web, paper side up, over Appliqué Pattern. Use a pencil to trace pattern, including centerline, 60 times, leaving 1/2" between tracings.
- 2. Cut out each fusible-web shape roughly 1/4" outside traced lines. To reduce bulk, cut 4/4" away from traced lines on inside of each shape.
- 3. Referring to Diagram 2, position four fusible-web shapes on wrong side of a large Four-Patch unit; align centerline of each template with a seam line on Four-Patch unit. Following manufacturer's instructions, press fusible web shapes onto unit; let cool. Cut out fabric shapes on drawn lines. Peel off paper backings. Repeat with remaining large Four-Patch units for 15 sets of four appliqués total.

Appliqué Blocks

- 1. Position four appliqués atop a matching small Four-Patch unit, matching seam lines and raw edges. Fuse in place.
- 2. Using clear, monofilament thread in the needle, neutral thread in the bobbin, and a narrow zigzag stitch, machineapplique along curved edges and short, straight edges of each appliqué to make a Lover's Knot block (Diagram 3). The block should be 6½" square including seam allowances.
- 3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make 15 Lover's Knot blocks total.

Assemble Quilt Top

- **1.** Referring to photo, sew together blocks in five horizontal rows. Press seams in one direction. alternating direction with each row.
- 2. Join rows to make guilt center. Press seams in one direction. The guilt center should be 18½×30½" including seam allowances.
- 3. Sew long inner border strips to long edges of quilt center. Add short inner border strips to remaining edges. Press all seams toward inner border.
- 4. Sew long outer border strips to long edges of quilt center. Add short outer border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press all seams toward outer border.


Finish Ouilt

- 1. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste. Quilt as desired.
- 2. Bind with red floral binding strips.




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
