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Project: Striking Stripes Purse

INSPIRED BY DAY TO NIGHT FROM DESIGNER MONIQUE DILLARD OF OPEN GATE QUILTS (OPENGATEQUILTS.COM) QUILT TESTER: JAN RAGALLER



Add some pizzazz to your wardrobe with a trendy bright purse composed of a multicolor stripe that stands out against a black-and-white print binding. The fabric-covered button and adjustable strap make the purse both stylish and functional.

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Materials

- 5/8 yard green dot (lining, bag bottom insert)
- 1 yard multicolor lengthwise stripe (outer bag, strap)
- ½ yard black-and-white print (bag sides, strap tabs, binding)
- 7/8 yard of 20"-wide lightweight iron-on fusible interfacing
- 7/8 yard of 20"-wide fusible (on one side only) fleece
- 2—1½"-diameter O-rings
- ½"-diameter magnetic snap closure
- 1½"-diameter button to cover
- 3×11" piece heavy cardboard or plastic mesh

Finished bag: 12×8½×3" (excluding strap)

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Cut Fabrics

Cut pieces in the following order. Tab Pattern is on page 7.

From green dot, cut:

- 1—13×30" lining rectangle
- 1—7×12" rectangle
- 1—4×18" lining strip

From multicolor stripe (with stripe parallel to long edge and desired motif centered), cut:

- 1—13×30" rectangle
- 1—4×18" lining strip
- 2—3×36" strips
- 1—3" square

From black-and-white print, cut:

- Enough 2½"-wide bias strips to total 60" in length for binding
- 4-2**½**×6" rectangles
- 1-2**1/8**×12" strip
- 1—2**1/8**×8" strip

From fusible interfacing, cut:

- 1—13×30" rectangle
- 1—4×18" strip
- 2-2½×6" rectangles

From fusible fleece, cut:

- 1—13×30" rectangle
- 1-4×18" strip
- 2—1×36" strips

Quilt Bag Body and Sides

- 1. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse 13×30" interfacing to wrong side of green dot 13×30" lining rectangle. Fuse 13×30" fusible fleece to wrong side of multicolor stripe 13×30" rectangle.
- 2. Place fused green dot rectangle atop fused multicolor stripe rectangle with interfacing and fleece sides together; pin or baste.
- **3.** Repeat steps 1 and 2 using green dot, multicolor stripe, interfacing, and fleece 4×18" strips.
- **4.** Quilt fabric rectangles and strips layered in steps 2 and 3 using a diagonal grid pattern with the stitched lines 2" apart.
- 5. Centering stripe, trim quilted 13×30" rectangle into a 12×28" rectangle for the bag body (front, back, and flap). Cut quilted 4×18" strip into two 3×8½" strips; trim strips as shown in Diagram 1 for bag sides.

Prepare Strap Tabs

1. Fuse a 2½×6" interfacing rectangle to wrong side of a black-and-white print 2½×6" rectangle.

- 2. Trace Tab Pattern onto interfacing side of Step 1 fused rectangle.
- 3. Layer marked rectangle and a second black-and-white print 2½×6" rectangle with right sides together. Sew on drawn line, leaving narrow end open (Diagram 2). Trim ¼" outside stitching line. Trim across corners and clip just up to stitching at inner corners. Turn right side out and press to make a tab.
- **4.** Repeat steps 1-3 to make second tab.
- 5. Referring to Diagram 3, position tabs on bag body ¾" from long edges and 10½" from a short (flap) end. Pin in place.
- 6. Slip narrow end of a tab through an O-ring. Tuck narrow tab end under wide tab end. Stitch across narrow part of tab above O-ring (Diagram 4). In the wide part of the tab, stitch around the edges and make an X to make a strap tab. Repeat to make a second strap tab.

Assemble Bag

Referring to Diagram 5, bind 2" end of each bag side with black-and-white print 2½x8" strip. Using black-and-white print 2½x12" strip, bind the short end of bag body that is farthest from strap tabs.



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- 2. With lining sides together, place a bag side along a bag body long edge; align bound upper edges (Diagram 6). Join long edges, stopping 1/4" from bag side short edge. Clip bag body to seam line. Bring bag body up and turn corner; stitch bag body to bottom edge of bag side. Stop 1/4" from bag side long edge, bring bag body up and turn corner; stitch bag body to remaining long edge of bag side (Diagram 7). The portion of bag body that extends above bag side will become the flap.
- Repeat Step 2 to join remaining bag side to remaining long edge of bag body.
- 4. To create the flap, mark with pins 1" above bag back at both side edges (Diagram 8). Mark 5" from each side edge at free end of flap. Using a pencil and a straight edge, mark lines between pins; cut along marked lines.
- 5. Starting with bag front, use black-and-white print 2½"-wide bias strips to bind all raw edges, mitering binding at corners.

Assemble and Add Strap


Join a pair of short ends of multicolor stripe 3x36" strips to make a strap strip; press seam open. Fold a strap strip long edge under 1/4"; press. Fold folded edge under 1/2" (Diagram 9); press. Open up the last fold.


- 2. Center 1×36" fleece strips on wrong side of strap strip; fuse. Fold raw long edge of strip over fleece. Refold opposite long edge on fold line; pin in place, then press. Referring to Diagram 9, stitch through center of strip to make the strap.
- 3. Trim strap to desired length.
 Thread one end of strap through
 both O-rings. Fold one end of
 strap under ½"; fold other end
 of strap over ½" (Diagram 10).
 Nest the folded ends to enclose
 raw edges; pin. Topstitch along
 both edges.

Finish Bag

- Position and attach magnetic snap closure on bag front and flap at desired location according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Following manufacturer's directions, cover button using multicolor stripe 3" square. Sew button in place on right side of flap atop snap position.
- 3. Fold green dot 7×12" rectangle in half with right side inside to make a 3½×12" rectangle. Sew along one short end and long edge with a scant ½" seam (Diagram 11). Turn right side out; press. Insert cardboard or plastic mesh 3×11" rectangle. Hand-sew remaining short end closed to make bag bottom insert. Place bag bottom insert into bag to reinforce bag bottom and complete bag.

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




