

PROJECT: Peppermint Pillow Piece a sweet pillow to display during the holidays.

FABRICS are from the Winter Wonder collection by Heather Peterson for Riley Blake Designs (rileyblakedesigns.com).



PILLOW

Finished size: 16" square Finished block: 12" square

MATERIALS

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

- □ 9×21" piece (fat eighth) *each* red print and white print (block)
- □ ²/₃ yards brown print (block, border, pillow back)
- □ 16¹/₂"-square batting
- □ 16¹/2"-square muslin
- □ 16"-square pillow form

CUT FABRICS

Cut pieces in the following order.

From red print, cut:

- 2—5" squares
- 4—1¹⁄₂×2¹⁄₂" rectangles
- 4—1¹⁄2" squares

From brown print, cut:

- 2—10³⁄₄×16¹⁄₂" rectangles
- $2-\frac{21}{2}\times16\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
- 2—2¹/₂×12¹/₂" rectangles
- $2-\frac{2^{1}}{2}\times9^{1}/2$ rectangles
- $2-2\frac{1}{2}\times7\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
- 4—2¹⁄2" squares
- $2-1\frac{1}{2}\times2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
- 6—1¹/2" squares

From white print, cut:

■ 2—5" squares

ASSEMBLE PILLOW TOP

 Sew together a red print 1½" square and a brown print 1½" square (Diagram 1). Add a brown print 1½×2½" rectangle to left-hand edge to make Unit A. The unit should be 2½" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make two A units total.

- 2) Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each white print 5" square, remaining brown print 1½" squares, and remaining red print 1½" squares.
- 3) Referring to Diagram 2, layer a marked white print 5" square atop a red print 5" square. Sew together with two seams, stitching ¼" on each side of drawn line. Cut pair apart on drawn line. Press open to make two triangle-squares. Trim each triangle-square to 4¼2" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four triangle-squares total.
- 4) Sew together triangle-squares in pairs (Diagram 3). Join pairs to make a Pinwheel Unit. The unit should be 8¹/₂" square including seam allowances.
- 5) Referring to Diagram 4, align brown print 2½" squares in top left-hand and bottom right-hand corners of Pinwheel Unit. Noting orientation of red print squares, align A units in remaining Pinwheel Unit corners. Mark a diagonal line on each brown print square and A unit. Sew on drawn lines. Trim seam allowances to ¼". Press open attached corners to make a Peppermint Unit. The unit still should be 8½" square including seam allowances.
- 6) Align a marked brown print 1¹/₂" square with one end of a red print 1¹/₂×2¹/₂" rectangle (Diagram 5; note direction of drawn line). Stitch, trim, and press as before to make Unit B. The unit still should be 1¹/₂×2¹/₂" including seam allowances. Repeat to make a second B unit.
- 7) Reversing direction of drawn line, repeat Step 6 to make two C units (Diagram 5).

- 8) Align a marked red print 1¹/₂" square with one corner of a remaining brown print 2¹/₂" square (Diagram 6). Stitch, trim, and press to make Unit D. Repeat to make a second D unit.
- 9) Sew together one Unit B and one brown print 2¹/₂×7¹/₂" rectangle to make a Side Unit (Diagram 7). The unit should be 2¹/₂×8¹/₂" including seam allowances. Repeat to make a second Side Unit.
- Sew together one brown print 2¹/₂×9¹/₂" rectangle, one Unit C, and one Unit D to make a Top/ Bottom Unit (Diagram 8). The unit should be 2¹/₂×12¹/₂" including seam allowances. Repeat to make a second Top/Bottom Unit.
- 11) Lay out Side Units, Top/Bottom Units, and Peppermint Unit in three rows (Diagram 9). Sew together pieces in middle row. Join rows to make a block. The block should be 12¹/₂" square including seam allowances.
- 12) Referring to Pillow Top Assembly Diagram, sew brown print 2¹/₂×12¹/₂" rectangles to opposite edges of block. Sew brown print 2¹/₂×16¹/₂" rectangles to remaining edges to make pillow top. The pillow top should be 16¹/₂" square including seam allowances.

FINISH PILLOW

- Place pillow top right side up; top with batting and muslin squares. Quilt as desired.
- Turn one long edge of each brown print 10³/₄×16¹/₂" rectangle under 1/4"; press. Turn same edges under 1/4" again; stitch in place to hem. Each hemmed rectangle should be 10¹/₄×16¹/₂" including seam allowances.

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- 3) Referring to Pillow Back Assembly Diagram, overlap hemmed rectangle edges by 4" to make a 16¹/₂" square. Stitch across overlapped edges to make pillow back.
- 4) Layer pillow top and pillow back with right sides together. Stitch ¼" from edges to make pillow cover. Turn right side out through opening in pillow back; press.
- **5)** Insert pillow form through opening to complete pillow.


















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PILLOW TOP ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM
