

# Blast from the Past Sampler: Block 21

From All that Glitters by designer Wendy Sheppard (ivoryspring.wordpress.com)
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## FINISHED BLOCK: 9" square

#### **MATERIALS**

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

- □ 10" square dark print
- □ 9×21" piece (fat eighth) light print
- □ 9×21" piece (fat eighth) medium print

#### **CUT FABRICS**

Cut pieces in the following order.

#### From dark print, cut:

- $\Box$  1-23/4" square
- □ 8-15/8" squares

# From light print, cut:

- $\square$  8–2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares
- $\Box$  4-1<sup>5</sup>/8×2<sup>3</sup>/4" rectangles
- $\Box$  4-15/8" squares

## From medium print, cut:

- $\Box$  4-2 $^{3}/_{4}\times$ 5" rectangles
- $\Box$  4-2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares

## ASSEMBLE BLOCK

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Press seams in directions indicated by arrows on diagrams. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

**1** Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each dark print 15/8" square and light print 23/4" square.

2 Align a marked dark print square with one end of a light print 15/8×23/4" rectangle (Diagram 1; note direction of marked line). Sew on marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press open attached triangle. Add a second marked dark print square to opposite end of same rectangle to make a small Flying Geese unit. The unit still should be 15/8×23/4" including seam allowances. Repeat to make four small Flying Geese units total.

Jusing marked light print 23/4" squares and medium print 23/4×5" rectangles, repeat Step 2 to make four large Flying Geese units (**Diagram 2**). Each large Flying Geese unit still should be 23/4×5" including seam allowances.





Referring to **Diagram 3**, sew together light print 15/8" squares, small Flying Geese units, and dark print 23/4" square in three rows. Join rows to make a small star unit. The unit should be 5" square including seam allowances.




**5** Referring to **Diagram 4**, sew together medium print 23/4" squares, large Flying Geese units, and small star unit in three rows. Join rows to make block. The block should be 91/2" square including seam allowances.




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




Coloring Diagram
