## PROJECT: Dream Catchers

Create a colorful baby quilt with bright tonal fabrics.
INSPIRED BY: All Hallows' Eve from designer Joanna Figueroa (figtreequilts.com) QUILT TESTER: Julie Doy


FABRICS are from the Color Club collection by Heather Valentine for Windham Fabrics (windhamfabrics.com).

## FINISHED QUILT:

42½" square
FINISHED BLOCK:
12" square
Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.
$\square 17 / 8$ yards white print (blocks, border)
$\square 9-9 \times 21 "$ pieces (fat eighths) assorted prints in red, yellow, aqua, green, teal, coral, blue, orange, and purple (blocks)
$\square 1 / 2$ yard teal print (binding)
$\square 23 / 4$ yards backing fabric
$\square$ 50"-square batting

## CUT FABRICS

Cut pieces in the following order.

From white print, cut:
$\square 4-31 / 2 \times 42$ " strips for border

- $9-4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- $36-2 \frac{1}{2} \times 4^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
$\square 180-2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

From each assorted print, cut:
$\square 8-2 \frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
$\square 4-2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
From teal print, cut:
$\square 5-2 \frac{1}{2} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ binding strips

## ASSEMBLE BLOCKS

Measurements include $1 / 44^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Press seams in directions indicated by arrows on diagrams. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

1. Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of 144 white print $212^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
2. Gather 16 marked white print $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, four unmarked white print $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, four white print $2 \frac{1}{2} \times 4^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, one set of assorted print pieces (eight $21 / 2 \times 41 / 2$ " rectangles and four $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares), and one white print $41 / 2$ " square.
B. Referring to Diagram 1, sew together an unmarked white print $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square and a print $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " square. Add a white print $21 / 2 \times 4^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to make a corner unit. The unit should be $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four corner units total.

4. Referring to Diagram 2, align a marked white print square with one end of an assorted print $21 / 2 \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Sew on marked line. Trim seam allowance to $1 / 44^{\prime \prime}$. Press open attached triangle. In the same manner add a marked white print square to opposite end of rectangle to make a Flying Geese unit. The unit still should be $21 / 2 \times 41 / 2^{\text {" }}$ including seam allowances. Repeat to make eight Flying Geese units total.

5. Referring to Diagram 3, sew together two Flying Geese units to make a side unit. The unit should be $41 / 2$ " square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four side units total.

C. Referring to Diagram 4, lay out corner units, side units, and white print $41 / 2$ " square in three rows. Sew together pieces in rows. Join rows to make a block. The block should be $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square including seam allowances.

7. Repeat steps 2-6 to make nine blocks total.

## ASSEMBLE QUILT TOP

1. Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, lay out blocks in three rows. Sew together blocks in rows. Press seams in one direction, alternating direction with each row. Join rows to make quilt center; press seams in one direction. The quilt center should be $361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square including seam allowances.
2. Piece and cut white print $31 / 2 \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ strips to make:

- $2-3 ½ \times 421 / 2$ " border strips
$\square 2-3 ½ \times 361 / 2$ " border strips
B. Sew short border strips to opposite edges of quilt center. Add long border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press seams toward border.
