

PROJECT: Dream Catchers

Create a colorful baby quilt with bright tonal fabrics.

INSPIRED BY: All Hallows' Eve from designer Joanna Figueroa (figtreequilts.com) QUILT TESTER: Julie Doy



FABRICS are from the Color Club collection by Heather Valentine for Windham Fabrics (windhamfabrics.com).

FINISHED QUILT: 42¹/₂" square

FINISHED BLOCK: 12" square

Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.

- □ 1⁷/₈ yards white print (blocks, border)
- 9—9×21" pieces (fat eighths) assorted prints in red, yellow, aqua, green, teal, coral, blue, orange, and purple (blocks)
- □ 1/2 yard teal print (binding)
- □ 2¾ yards backing fabric
- □ 50"-square batting

CUT FABRICS

Cut pieces in the following order.

From white print, cut:

□ 4-3¥2×42" strips for border □ 9-4¥2" squares □ 36-2¥2×4¥2" rectangles □ 180-2¥2" squares

From each assorted print, cut: $arrow 8-2\frac{1}{2}\times4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles $arrow 4-2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From teal print, cut: □ 5-2**1**/₂×42" binding strips

ASSEMBLE BLOCKS

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Press seams in directions indicated by arrows on diagrams. If no direction is specified, press seam toward darker fabric.

L• Use a pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of 144 white print 2¹/₂" squares.

QUILTING

2. Gather 16 marked white print 2½" squares, four unmarked white print 2½" squares, four white print 2½×4½" rectangles, one set of assorted print pieces (eight 2½×4½" rectangles and four 2½" squares), and one white print 4½" square.


3. Referring to **Diagram 1**, sew

together an unmarked white print 2½" square and a print 2½" square. Add a white print 2½2×4½" rectangle to make a corner unit. The unit should be 4½" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four corner units total.

4 • Referring to **Diagram 2**, align a marked white print square with one end of an assorted print 2½×4½" rectangle. Sew on marked line. Trim seam allowance to ¼". Press open attached triangle. In the same manner add a marked white print square to opposite end of rectangle to make a Flying Geese unit. The unit still should be 2½×4½" including seam allowances. Repeat to make eight Flying Geese units total.



5. Referring to Diagram 3, sew together two Flying Geese units to make a side unit. The unit should be 4½" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make four side units total.



6. Referring to **Diagram 4**, lay out corner units, side units, and white print 4¹/₂" square in three rows. Sew together pieces in rows. Join rows to make a block. The block should be 12¹/₂" square including seam allowances.



7. Repeat steps 2-6 to make nine blocks total.

ASSEMBLE QUILT TOP


■ Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, lay out blocks in three rows. Sew together blocks in rows. Press seams in one direction, alternating direction with each row. Join rows to make quilt center; press seams in one direction. The quilt center should be 36¹/2" square including seam allowances.

2. Piece and cut white print 3½×42" strips to make:
□ 2-3½×42½" border strips
□ 2-3½×36½" border strips

3. Sew short border strips to opposite edges of quilt center. Add long border strips to remaining edges to complete quilt top. Press seams toward border.

FINISH QUILT

1• Layer quilt top, batting, and backing; baste.

2. Quilt as desired. Handi Quilter Studio Educator Kristina Whitney used quilting rulers to machine-quilt an hourglass in each block center, four patches on point in the background, and ghost block shapes in the border (Quilting Diagram). She added freehand continuous-curve quilting to the white triangles in the Flying Geese units.

3. Bind with teal print binding strips.
